- Easy to set up
- Easy to record high-quality screencasts
- Easy to share online with students or other teachers

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Screencasting Tools


A screencast is a video recording of your computer screen, and usually includes audio.

Screencasting, also referred to as video screen capture, is a great way to

teach or share ideas.

Common examples of screencasts are:

- Onscreen tutorials
- Video lessons
- Slideshare presentations



Screencastify Features



Free Features:

- Record up to 10 minutes per video with an embedded Screencastify watermark.
- Make up to 50 recordings each month.
- Upload to Google Drive or YouTube.

Paid Features:

- Unlimited recording length and number of recordings.
- No watermark.
- Cropping and trimming tools.
- MP4 and Animated GIF export.

Comparing Screencastify



Screencastify ::



- Chrome extension
- Free to record whole screen; no screenshot capability
- Allows for video sharing between teachers and students

Snagit 5:

- Windows, Mac, iOS, Android, Chrome
- \$50 for license
- Screen-capture and screenshot capability
- Easy sharing to Youtube and Google drive

Captivate 4:

- Windows & Mac OS
- \$29.99 per month or \$1099 regular (\$349 Student/Teacher)
- Screen-capture and eLearning authoring tool
 - SCORM files must be web-hosted or upload to an in LMS

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
Save Video to Disk



With the unpaid version, your recordings are automatically uploaded to Google Drive and easily shared to YouTube.

The upgraded (paid) version of Screencastify allows you to export your recordings to your device as an:

- Animated GIF (size options available)
- MP4 video
